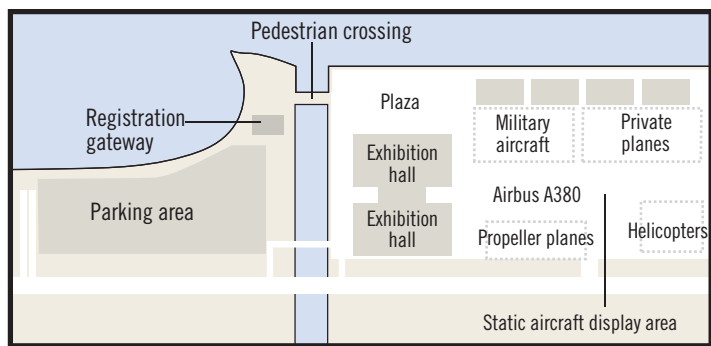


The Big, the Small & the Pretty

HOW TO GET THERE

» By shuttle bus (\$5 a trip)

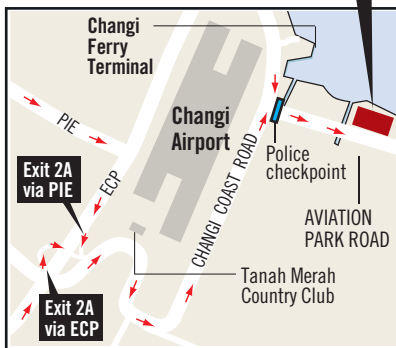

» By taxi

There is a taxi bay at the exhibition site. An additional location surcharge of \$8 applies for taxis leaving the site.

» By car

Liberty XL2

(Liberty Aerospace)

Length: 6.2m

Single-propeller for personal transportation, touring and flight training



Fire Scout

(Northrop Grumman)

Length: 7m

Unmanned helicopter used by US Navy for reconnaissance and precision targeting support



Global Hawk

(Northrop Grumman)

Length: 13.5m

Unmanned aerial vehicle used by US Air Force as a surveillance aircraft



EC155

(Eurocopter)

Length: 14.3m

For passenger transport, VIP corporate transport and casualty transport



P180 Avanti II

(Piaggio Aero Industries)

Length: 14.4m

Unusual design includes engines that face backwards and a blended wing body

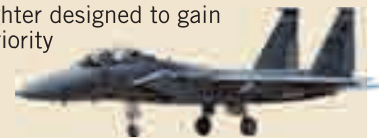


F-15D

Length: 19.4m

All-weather tactical fighter designed to gain and maintain air superiority in aerial combat

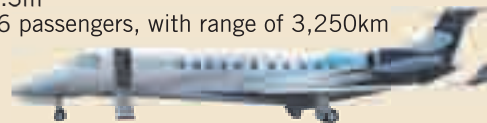


Legacy 600

Can seat 16 passengers, with range of 3,250km

Length: 29.4m

Business jet with longest range (10,742km) in the world

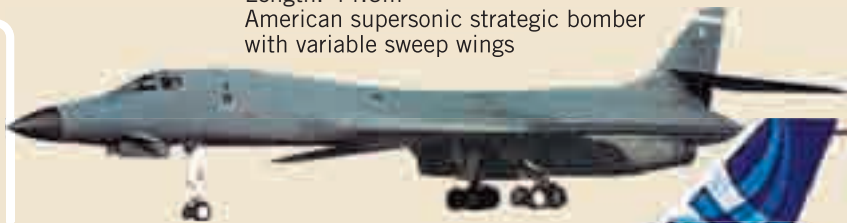


B-1B
