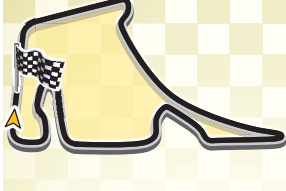


10 GERMANY **July 20****Hockenheimring, Hockenheim**

DOWN THE STRAIGHT

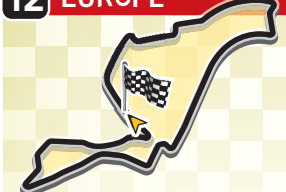

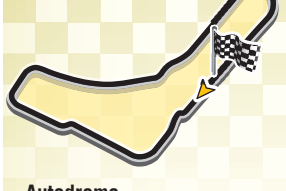
Europe's second street circuit, this new race will be set against a backdrop of the America's Cup port.

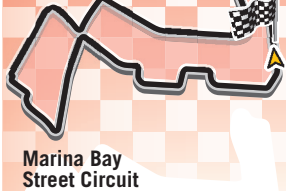
The longest and second fastest race on the calendar and one of the all-time greats, despite struggling with poor attendances and financial problems. Weather conditions are unpredictable.
