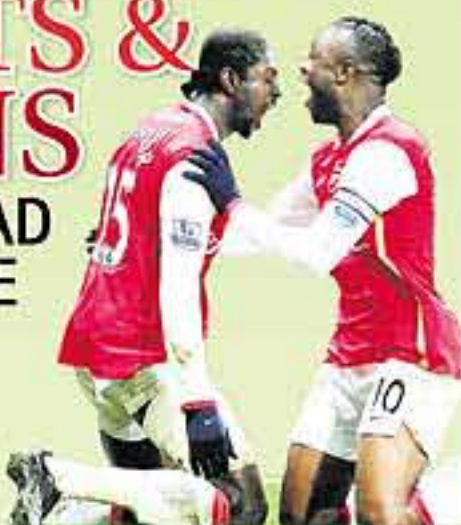


TWISTS & TURNS
