

## ■ SUBSIDY LEVELS

From Jan 1, the amount of subsidy will depend on the patient's income

Monthly Income of Patient	C Class	B2 Class
\$3,200 and below	80%	65%
\$3,201 - \$3,350	79%	64%
\$3,351 - \$3,500	78%	63%
\$3,501 - \$3,650	77%	62%
\$3,651 - \$3,800	76%	61%
\$3,801 - \$3,950	75%	60%
\$3,951 - \$4,100	74%	59%
\$4,101 - \$4,250	73%	58%
\$4,251 - \$4,400	72%	57%
\$4,401 - \$4,550	71%	56%
\$4,551 - \$4,700	70%	55%
\$4,701 - \$4,850	69%	54%
\$4,851 - \$5,000	68%	53%
\$5,001 - \$5,100	67%	52%
\$5,101 - \$5,200	66%	51%
\$5,201 and above	65%	50%

### TWO EXAMPLES:

Mr Tan earns \$3,900 a month. With one month's bonus, his annual pay is \$50,700. This is divided by 12 to give his real monthly income of \$4,225. He is entitled to a 73% subsidy in C class or 58% subsidy in B2.

### Heart failure: Bill of \$2,880 before subsidy

For C class	Subsidy	Total bill	MediShield	Medisave	Cash
Previously	80%	\$576	0	\$576	0

If he earns \$5,201 or more	65%	\$1,008	0	\$1,008	0

For B2 class	Subsidy	Total bill	MediShield	Medisave	Cash
Previously	65%	\$1,008	0	\$1,008	0
From today	58%	\$1,210	0	\$1,210	0
If he earns \$5,201 or more	50%	\$1,440	0	\$1,440	0

MediShield kicks in if the bill is more than \$1,000 for a C class ward.
