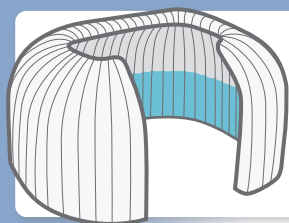


This operating theatre is inflatable and can be carried around in a standard backpack. Here's what is in this theatre used for simulated surgery.



### INFLATABLE IGLOO

This 2m-tall inflatable 'igloo' can be pumped with air and completely inflated in three minutes. It mimics the constrained space of the operating theatre, and can fit the usual operating staff size of 12.

### LAMPHEAD

A camera in the lamphead records the students' performance. They can then play the recording back to see how they responded to situations.

### EQUIPMENT BANNERS

These show the anaesthetic and suturing equipment used in operating theatres to add to the realism.



### SILICONE ORGANS

Every organ in the body is recreated in silicone for students to work on. These include silicone skin pieces that are attached onto actors, so that students get to feel what it's like to work on a wound on a real person, complete with fake blood.



### IPAD SCREENS

Two screens display simulated patient observations such as blood pressure and oxygen levels. They are controlled via remote and the instructor can change the data manually.
